PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

ASSOCIATION COLLECTIONS

If your account is more than two years in arrears, ACMF can and will file a lien on your property. ACMF is responsible for maintenance and administration expenses for the general welfare of the subdivision. To meet that responsibility, each member must fulfill their obligation of payment.

RICHLAND-CHAMBERS RESERVOIR

Current Lake Level is 315 ft., 100% Full!!!

History

Due to a drought in 1956-1957 plans were made by the Tarrant Regional Water District to build the Richland-Chambers Reservoir with the purpose of being a public water source for Tarrant County. The plan called for a reservoir to be built along with a pipeline between Richland-Chambers and Lake Benbrook. However, no actions were taken until October 1, 1979 when the water district issued \$342.75 million in revenue bonds for construction.

The project was designed and engineered by Freese and Nichols, Consulting Engineers, of Fort Worth, Texas. Construction began on October 7, 1982. The dam was closed on Richland-Chambers Reservoir July 1987 and filled by May 1989. On November 12, 1988 the Richland-Chambers pipeline became operational.
